The Geochemistry Division Medal is awarded biennially by the ACS Division of Geochemistry, to an individual for outstanding accomplishment in any area of Geochemistry.

The award consists of an engraved bronze medallion, plus a \$2000 cash award. The awardee also receives an allowance for travel to the award ceremony, as well as registration costs for the Spring ACS National Meeting at which the award will be conferred.

The medallion is presented at a special Geochemistry Division award symposium. The Medal recipient is invited to nominate a small number of speakers for award symposium presentations.

Patrick G. Hatcher



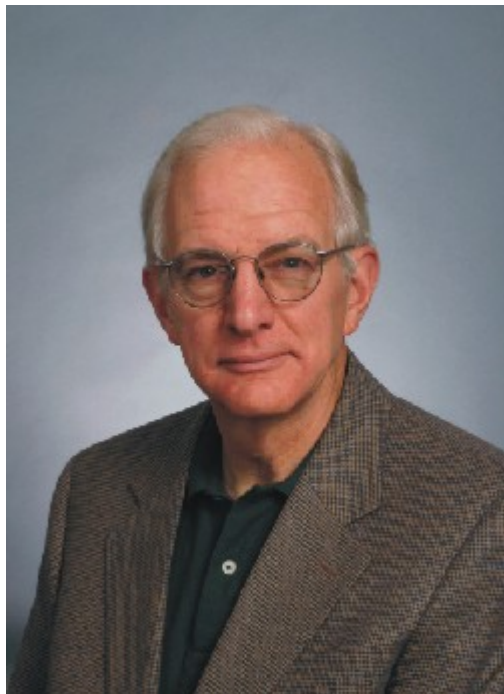
The ACS Division of Geochemistry is very pleased to announce that **Dr. Patrick G. Hatcher** has been awarded the 2005 Geochemistry Division Medal.

Patrick G. Hatcher has played a very influential role in the fields of organic geochemistry and environmental chemistry. His list of refereed publications is packed with important papers to which he has provided the crucial ingredient - deeply insightful application of a technique such as NMR. In many cases, the results have very significantly advanced our understanding of natural materials like coal, kerogen, humic materials, dissolved organic matter, and resistant biopolymers. The medal was presented to Dr. Hatcher by ACS President Bill Carroll during an [award symposium](#) at the ACS National Meeting in San Diego, March 13-17, 2005. All members and friends of the Division are invited to join us in recognizing and celebrating Dr Hatcher's accomplishments and contributions to the field of Geochemistry.

John M. Hayes



The ACS Division of Geochemistry is very pleased to announce that **Dr John M. Hayes** has been awarded the 2003 Geochemistry Division Medal.

Dr Hayes' is being recognized for his visionary contributions to an understanding of organic geochemistry, cosmochemistry, isotope geochemistry and paleoenvironmental analysis. His development of continuous-flow isotope ratio mass spectrometry techniques paved the way for compound-specific isotopic analysis, opened frontiers between isotopic and molecular organic chemistry, bridged the fields of geochemistry and biology and shed new light on modern and ancient biogeochemical processes.

The medal will be presented to Dr Hayes by ACS Past President Dr Edel Wasserman during an [award symposium](#) at the ACS National Meeting in New Orleans, March 23-27, 2003. All members and friends of the Division are invited to join us in recognizing and celebrating Dr Hayes' accomplishments and contributions to the field of Geochemistry.
