

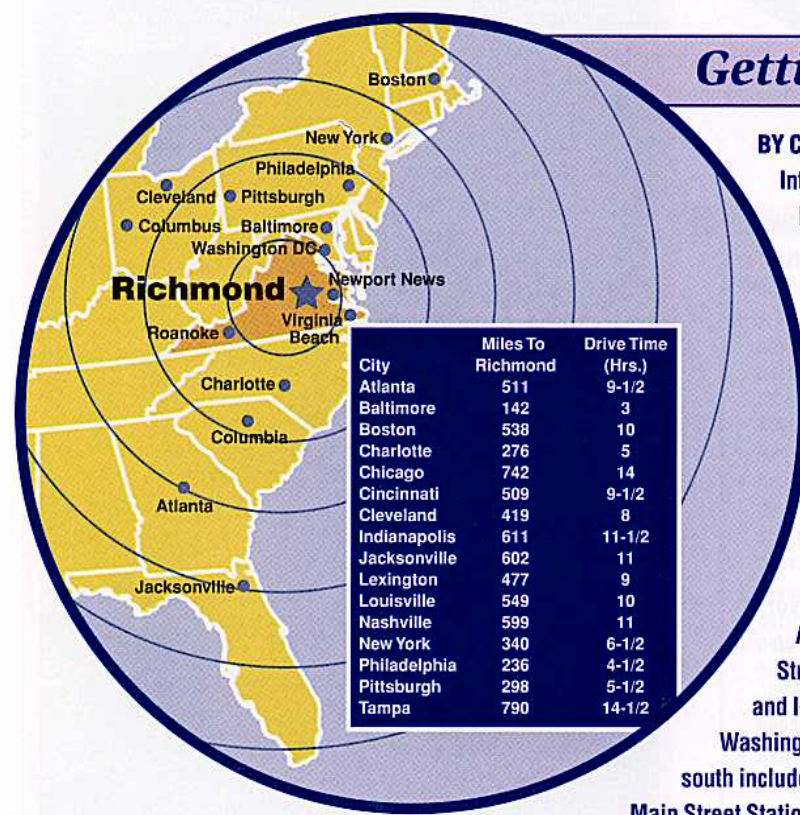
Easy Access

Getting Here

BY CAR

Interstates 95 and 64 are the major corridors providing access to the Richmond Region.

BY PLANE

Richmond International Airport (RIC), which is undergoing a major expansion that will include a new two-level terminal, is accessible from I-95, I-64 and I-295 and is within 15 minutes of downtown. With 180 daily flights, service is provided by AirTran, American, Continental, Delta, Northwest, United and USAirways. A shuttle or taxi trip from RIC to downtown Richmond costs \$15 to \$20. BY TRAIN

Amtrak service is located just off I-95 at downtown's historic Main Street Station, 1500 E. Main St. Trains also stop minutes from I-95 and I-64 at 7519 Staples Mill Road. Arrivals from the north include Washington, D.C., Philadelphia, New York and Boston. Arrivals from the south include Raleigh, N.C.; Columbia, S.C.; Tampa, Fla., and Orlando, Fla. BY BUS

A Greyhound/Trailways terminal is located minutes from downtown Richmond at 2910 N. Boulevard. For fare and schedule information, call (800) 231-2222.
